General Graduation Guidelines:

- Total of 120 semester hours, 39 of which must be numbered 300 or 400 (Other programs may require coursework beyond 120 semester hours)
- At least 9 semester hours of courses designated as writing intensive
- A declared major
- A cumulative GPA average of C (2.00) and at least a C average in the graduation major

WHAT YOU WILL LEARN:

- Examine religious beliefs, feelings and actions, to provide the student with the tools to understand the religious dimension of life, with particular concern for the Judeo-Christian tradition
- Study of Judaism, Christianity and Islam the major religions in the Abrahamic tradition
- Tools and techniques of Biblical interpretation
- Examine modern Christian faith; selected problems in theology, the Biblical and Modern-Christian concepts of man, the person and work of Jesus Christ, faith and reason and the nature of the church

- Study of the Christian movement, its organization, leadership, literature and theological development
- Basic principles and assumptions of the Christian concept of the good life and applications to contemporary life
- Study of Hinduism, Buddhism, Taoism and Confucianism, the major religions of the East
- Study of the indigenous religions of the Americas, including modern-day South and Central America and Canada
