**EARLY REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS**

1. Complete your Registration with your advisor. Registration is available electronically for Spring 2026. See your academic advisor and/or the Registrar's Office for more details or instructions for how to register for classes.
2. Early registration schedules for Honors Program students, sophomores, juniors and seniors may be completed online according to the following schedule based upon semester hours **successfully completed:**

3. Registration Window and Viewing Your Class Schedule. Students should check my.ncwu.edu (Student Tab – Academic Information – Student Schedule – Spring 2025 - 2026) to review their early registration schedule for Spring 2026 after the registration process has been completed. **Students may complete early registration via the online portal through Friday, December 5, 2025.** Thereafter, students must submit registration materials to the Registrar's Office with the appropriate advisor signature.
4. **All students planning to graduate in May 2026 should meet with their academic advisor to confirm their graduation status.** The application deadline has passed; those who applied should have received an assessment from the Registrar's Office. When registering for Spring 2026 classes, review your graduation application with your advisor to ensure all requirements will be met. If you haven't submitted a graduation application yet, **this is your final chance to qualify for May 2026 graduation. Apply via the [student portal](#) and indicate your intention on participating in the commencement ceremony no later than 12pm on Monday, January 26, 2026.** **Note:** Applications submitted after the final Spring 2026 registration deadline will not be accepted.

**RESOLVING HOLDS PRIOR TO REGISTRATION**

1. Resolve any and all account holds you may have. Your advisor can help you determine if you have a hold.
2. Complete Early Registration via the electronic portal.
3. Complete payment and/or payment arrangements of any outstanding balance. By registering for classes students request that NCWU apply and hold financial aid in their student account to cover the cost of attendance.

### REGISTERING FOR INTERNSHIPS – DOMESTIC/U.S. STUDENTS\*

To register for a credit-bearing internship, students should work with faculty sponsor to work on specific steps to prepare for internship placement, then:

- Student should complete the **NCWU Internship Application** and obtain the signatures of both the site supervisor and faculty sponsor.
- Student should submit Add/Drop form, Syllabus created by faculty internship sponsor, and Internship Contract to the Provost's Office with all required signatures. The Associate Provost will sign off on approved internships and work to register the students for the internship course with the Registrar's Office. **Internship documents received after the add/drop deadline may not be approved. The add/drop deadline is Wednesday, January 21, 2026.**

### REGISTERING FOR INTERNSHIPS – STUDENTS STUDYING ON F-1 VISAS\*

To register for a credit-bearing internship, students should work with faculty sponsor to work on specific steps to prepare for internship placement, then:

- Students should seek clearance from International Student Services (ISS) before pursuing registration for the internship.
- NCWU ISS Office must approve the internship as meeting U.S. government guidelines for *Curricular Practical Training*. This requires a detailed offer letter from the internship site supervisor.
- To get institutional approval to register for the internship, F-1 visa students must submit a registration form, syllabus created by the faculty internship sponsor, the formal offer letter from the internship site, and **the NCWU Internship Contract**. The Provost or designee will sign off on approved internships that have already been cleared by ISS and work to document registration with the ISS Director and the university Registrar.
- **Curricular Practical Training (CPT) internship documentation must be submitted for approval prior to the end of the add/drop period. Late submissions may not be approved. The last day to add a class in Spring 2026, including an internship, is Wednesday, January 21, 2026.**

\* For students wishing to take credit-bearing internships in SPT, JUS, EXS, HLP, and PSY, please see your faculty advisor for different protocols and procedures.

\* All internship applications and contracts may be obtained through either the Provost's Office (email [mwyatt@ncwu.edu](mailto:mwyatt@ncwu.edu)) or through a staff member in International Student Services. Internship forms will be posted on the NCWU website.

**ONLINE COURSES** - Students seeking to enroll in Adult & Professional online accelerated courses through cross-enrollment must meet the [University's established criteria](#). Approval is contingent upon meeting these requirements. Any exceptions to the policy must be authorized by the Provost or an official designee. Students requesting to cross-enroll may complete the [Cross-Enrollment Form](#) on the Registrar's website. Responses to requests are facilitated by Registrar's Office Staff.
