General Graduation Guidelines:

- Total of 120 semester hours, 33 of which must be numbered 300 or 400 (Other programs may require coursework beyond 120 semester hours)
- At least 9 semester hours of courses designated as writing intensive
- A declared major
- A cumulative GPA average of C (2.00) and at least a C average in the graduation major

WHAT YOU WILL LEARN:

- Apply research and analytic strategies, develop and practice program planning, implementation and evaluation skills, and explore policy development and advocacy.
- Understand and apply the basic principles of epidemiology, including rates, risk factors, disease determinants, causation, and public health surveillance.
- Grasp the history and role of public health in disease prevention and the importance of evidence-based public health practice.
- Comprehend the factors involved in population health and the basic processes, approaches, and interventions addressing major health-related needs and concerns.
- Recognize the social determinants of health, health behavior, and health policies influencing health outcomes.
- Identify population-based needs for public health programs and initiatives, develop appropriate programs, and evaluate their effectiveness.
- Demonstrate proficiency in the assessment, planning, and evaluation of public health programs, interventions, and initiatives.
