Program Start Dates:

*January, May, August***

General Graduation Guidelines:

- Total of 120 semester hours, 33 of which must be numbered 300 or 400 (Other programs may require coursework beyond 120 semester hours)
- At least 9 semester hours of courses designated as writing intensive
- A declared major
- A cumulative GPA average of C (2.00) and at least a C average in the graduation major

WHAT YOU WILL LEARN:

- Apply theories and concepts from the liberal arts, humanities and sciences as the foundation for professional nursing practice
- Provide competent professional nursing care
- Translate credible nursing research into evidence-based nursing practice
- Manage information technology to provide enhanced patient care in healthcare settings
- Demonstrate knowledge of healthcare policy, financial concepts and regulatory requirements
- Effectively communicate and collaborate to improve health outcomes and minimize risks
- Apply and analyze principles of prevention and health promotion

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA:

Students should have the following minimum criteria to be accepted for admission:

- Associate Degree (ADN) or diploma in nursing from a regionally accredited institution
- A current, unencumbered license as a Registered Nurse from the state in which the student resides***
- Transcripts from all previously attended institutions
- Minimum GPA of 2.0 and must have a "C" or better in all transfer credits
- "C" or better in all required nursing prerequisites

NOTE:

- General education courses can be taken before or during the major coursework but must be completed prior to NUR 330 and NUR 335. All electives must be completed prior to NUR 410.
- Students can transfer up to 90 credits from a four-year institution and up to 86 credits from an ADN. Transfer students may need additional general education and/or elective hours to fulfill degree requirements. The total hours needed and specific coursework will depend on individual transcript analysis.

**This does not include required general education courses, as this may differ per student based on what they are able to transfer in to the program.*

*** NUR major courses start in January, May and August. Students can also begin with general education and/or elective requirements in March, June and October.*
