General Graduation Guidelines:

- Total of 120 semester hours, 39 of which must be numbered 300 or 400 (Other programs may require coursework beyond 120 semester hours)
- At least 9 semester hours of courses designated as writing intensive
- A declared major
- A cumulative GPA average of C (2.00) and at least a C average in the graduation major

WHAT YOU WILL LEARN:

- To develop a sociological perspective on social behavior that is based on the scientific method rather than on common sense or one's personal social background/experiences
- To gain insight into how societal-level institutions impact individuals
- To understand how groups provide a context in which to socialize individuals, and to further examine the differences and similarities across these groups in their outcomes
- To use sociological theory in application to the many sociological issues, events, and topics of interest that the various subjects within the discipline provide
- To explore the various social science research methods, including the steps in the quantitative research process specifically - allowing for opportunities to critique and to carry out parts of specific research design types
